Brief summary of the content of the workshop	The workshop was on digital literacy for the teaching and learning of languages. The project team succeeded in completing the goals of the seminar which were to introduce the participants to the pedagogical approach based on social interactions and the creation of real-world tasks. Numerous resources for language activities were demonstrated and suggested.





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What did you find particularly useful?	The project team designed the tasks in accordance with the pedagogical approach they presented. The actual engagement of the participants in creation of real-world tasks was particularly useful. The fact that those tasks were to be integrated into the project inspired the participants in providing interesting contributions.
How will you use what you learnt / developed in the event in your professional context?	I am planning to use the apps and resources that were suggested during the workshop for language activities.  Registering with some platforms, such as <a href="https://ec.europa.eu/epale/">www.etwinning.net</a> or <a href="https://ec.europa.eu/epale/">https://ec.europa.eu/epale/</a> seems to be the next logical step in directing students towards real-world tasks and autonomy in the long run.
How will you further contribute to the project?	Together with my students, I will try to create a real-world task that might be considered to be added to the project.
How do you plan to disseminate the project?  - to colleagues - to a professional association - in a professional journal/website - in a newspaper - other	Together with my colleagues from the English Language Teachers Association (ELTA Serbia), I have been engaged in creating a one-day seminar to be accredited by Serbian Ministry of Education for the period of the next three school years, from 2018 to 2020. One segment of the seminar will be about real-world tasks with references to the project and the workshop on digital literacy.  I plan to have a report on the workshop <i>Digital Literacy</i> published in the January-February issue of the <i>ELTA Serbia Newsletter</i> .

Дводневни семинар под називом *Digital literacy for the teaching and learning of languages*, одржан је 10-11. октобра 2017. године, у организацији Европског центра за савремене језике (ЕСМL), са седиштем у Грацу. Пројектни тим од шест чланова из Европе и Канаде, на челу са Кристијаном Оливијером (Christian Ollivier), успешно је угостио, подучио и инспирисао око четрдесет учесника из тридесет и четири земље. Кроз актуелну тему о дигиталној писмености неопходној у подучавању и учењу језика, ЕСМL тим у потпуности је испунио своје циљеве: упознао је учеснике са педагошким приступом заснованом на друштвеној интеракцији, као и са креирањем стварних, животних задатака за ученике (realworld tasks). Пројектни тим је осмислио радионице и задатке у складу са педагошким приступом који је представљен. Ангажовање учесника у изради стварних задатака било је





изузетно корисно и инспиративно, а чињеница да ће неки од урађених задатака бити прикључени пројекту, додатно је мотивисала учеснике да дају свој максимум. Кроз дискусију и групни рад, уз *online* активности у фазама пре семинара, у току семинара и након завршетка, у пријатељској и радној атмосфери, учесници су били изузетно продуктивни и дошло је до драгоцене размене искуства. Отворене су бројне теме на форуму, представљене су бројне апликације, платформе и линкови, који су од значаја за даљи рад учесника у подучавању језика и усмеравању ученика ка аутономности и целоживотном учењу.
