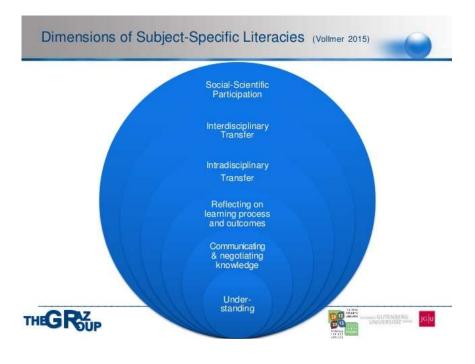

# **Keys for EOL**

Dimensions of subject specific literacies draws on language resources, either in the mother tongue or in other languages which are part of the learner's repertoire.

"Language as a means learning about the world. It models learning as a process of making meaning, and language learning as building meaning making potential to meaning in particular contexts. Knowledge is viewed as meaning, resource for а understanding and acting on the ΑII knowledge constituted in semiotic systems with language as the most central." (Mohan et al. 2010:221)
