Brief summary of the content of the workshop	This two-day workshop at ECML in Graz, Austria developed through a number of steps that should be taken by interested participants so that learning environments where multilingualism and plurilingualism flourish can be promoted. First, the EOL project was presented and, then, the symbiotic approach of designing priorities and defining new strategies was explained. Last but not least, setting up a school plan and implementing EOL in one's specific environment was demonstrated through a hands-on workshop.
What did you find particularly useful?	Two aspects of the workshop were particularly useful: a) getting to know a great number of colleagues from different European countries and collaborating with them and exchanging ideas b) the versatility and flexibility of how the EOL matrix can be implemented in different contexts.
How will you use what you learnt / developed in the event in your professional context?	I will certainly organize training sessions to acquaint EFL teachers in my jurisdiction with ECML and the way they can promote plurilingualism in their schools exploiting the loads of materials available at the ECML site.
How will you further contribute to the project?	I am available to be involved in any project that I can be of help. I plan to read more about the ways I can contribute and actively participate with innovative ideas.
How do you plan to disseminate the project? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - to colleagues - to a professional association - in a professional journal/website - in a newspaper - other 	I have already disseminated material and web links to groups of EFL teachers. In the future I will schedule a number of training sessions and workshops. I could also organize a greater event in the area of Athens or elsewhere around Greece with invited speakers and trainers from ECML. I will add a link to ECML's site as well as relevant material to my professional website which is under construction at the moment.

Στις 7 & 8 Μαρτίου 2019 πραγματοποιήθηκε στο Ευρωπαϊκό Κέντρο Σύγχρονων Γλωσσών του Συμβουλίου της Ευρώπης, στο Γκρατς της Αυστρίας, διήμερο εργαστήριο με συμμετέχοντες από 28 διαφορετικές Ευρωπαϊκές χώρες και εκπαιδευτές/εισηγητές τα μέλη της ομάδας του σχεδίου έρευνας δράσης EOL (Environments where languages can flourish/Περιβάλλοντα όπου οι Γλώσσες ευδοκimoύν). Πιο συγκεκριμένα, η ομάδα του έργου παρουσίασε τη συγκεκριμένη δράση ως μια ολιστική, οικοσυστημική προσέγγιση με στόχο την προώθηση της πολυγλωσσίας. Αναλυτικότερα, για την επίτευξη αυτού του κοινού οράματος όπου όλες οι εκπαιδευτικές δομές θα συγκλίνουν στους τομείς της μάθησης, της διδασκαλίας, της διοίκησης των σχολικών μονάδων και του σχεδιασμού των εκπαιδευτικών πολιτικών σε εθνικό και διεθνές επίπεδο, σχεδιάστηκε ένα δυναμικό ψηφιακό εργαλείο (<https://eol.ecml.at/EOLMatrix/tabid/4174/Default.aspx>) όπου οι ενδιαφερόμενοι μπορούν να το αξιοποιήσουν έτσι ώστε, βασιζόμενοι στα θετικά στοιχεία του οργανισμού τους, να καταγράψουν τις προτεραιότητές τους και να σχεδιάσουν δράσεις οι οποίες θα προσφέρουν ευκαιρίες γλωσσικής και πολιτιστικής ανάπτυξης όλων των εμπλεκόμενων μελών τους και θα οδηγήσουν σε συνθήκες αμοιβαίας κατανόησης και ενεργής πολιτειότητας.
