

Creating space for additional foreign languages: opportunities and challenges

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Schools are autonomous in choosing foreign languages:

- Language A: English, German or French (B2-language in upper secondary);
- Language B chosen by schools (B1-language in upper secondary).

95% learn at least two foreign languages in basic education (Eurydice report).

Foreign languages in Estonian schools

Ca. 95% learn English as the first FL;

Ca. 75% learn Russian as the second foreign language (used to be 80% and above).



English being the overwhelming first foreign language means that the offer of second foreign language is the main means of creating diverse (foreign) language repertoires in schools.






Since 2023/2024, schools are obliged to offer a choice between at least 2 foreign languages to students who start learning their second foreign language.

Meaningful partnerships

- Teacher Associations;
- Institutes (Goethe, French, Finnish);
- International foreign language certificates, including Goethe, DSD, DELF, YKI (recognized as school-leaving exams).

Giving students an outlet: CertiLingua Label of Excellence

Network: Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Estonia, France, Germany, Italy, Sweden

Students receive certificates for:

- European and international competence;
- participation in (and documentation of) an international face-to-face project;
- B2 level (or higher) in at least two FLs learned in school. Certificate given on completing upper secondary education
