Workshoppen “Literacies through content and language integrated learning: effective learning across subjects and languages (CLIL)” blev afholdt i ECMLs hovedkvarter i Graz i Østrig i starten af juni 2015.

I workshoppen deltog en-to repræsentanter fra hvert af en lang række europæiske lande. De seneste tre-fire år har en tværeuropæisk forsker- og praktikergruppe arbejdet med at udvikle og sammentænke literacy- og CLIL-begreberne, således at der nu foreligger et teoretisk og samtidig praksisorienteret grundlag for forståelsen og anvendelsen af kombinationen af faglig- og sprogundervisning. Arbejdsguppen fremlagde sine væsentligste resultater for workshoppens deltagere og udbød sig feedback og kritik til brug for det videre arbejde med ’pluriliteracies’ og CLIL. Det er en af gruppens hovedteser, at faglig viden og kompetence er baseret på sprog, og at evnen til at formulere/udtrykke sig om et emne er afgørende for, om indlæring har fundet sted.

Workshopdeltagerne fik rig lejlighed til at kommentere gruppens arbejde og udarbejdede flere interessante forslag til justering og supplement, som blev vel modtaget af gruppens medlemmer, der fremstod som meget åbne og imødekommande. Arbejdet foregik i en særdeles god og positiv atmosfære, og networking-delen, der er et uundgåeligt element i et sådant tværnationalt forum, fungerede særdeles godt.
