Brief summary of the content of the workshop	The workshop dealt with the result of Language for Work network. There was also an expert lecture by professor Laurent Filliettaz, Université de Genève on recognising and sustaining linguistic demands at the workplace of today. Claire Extramiana presented an overview of the Council of Europe's LIAM working group. The presentation of ECML by Some of the participants presented posters and minor seminars on different subjects connected to the workshop theme. As a preparation for the workshop the participants had produced overviews of the policy and practice of language learning among migrants in the workplace in their own country. Interactive group work was an important item on the agenda all through the workshop and the online discussion tool enhanced the interaction during the event. We discussed different aspects of workplace learning and language learning for migrants. One important tool developed by the network is the website which will helpful for future cooperation and further development. The discussion among the participants was intense and gave much inspiration.
What did you find particularly useful?	It was interesting to find that participants from 31 countries with very different preconditions and experience could have so much in common and so fruitful discussions. The programme was well balanced with lectures and group work. The input from the lecturers gave me much inspiration and knowledge as did the contacts with the participants.
How will you use what you learnt/ developed in the event in your professional context?	I use the experiences in my work with developing new curriculums for workplace and language learning. We need to prepare managers, colleagues and also teachers for this didactic area.
How will you further contribute to the project?	I will give my results to the website and network members and I hope the application for Language for Work 2 will be approved.

Arbetsplatsen som navet i språkinlärningen

Nätverket Language for Work är ett europeiskt lärande nätverk för forskare, lärare, arbetsgivare, fackföreningar, politiska beslutsfattare och andra personer som arbetar i ett framväxande område: arbetsrelaterad inlärning av majoritetsspråket för invandrare och etniska minoriteter. Syftet med nätverket är att lära av varandra och hjälpa medlemmarna att utveckla praxis inom området. Language for Work finansieras och härbärgeras av Europarådet för moderna språk och startades 2012. Inom ramen för nätverket har en hemsida utvecklats och ett antal möten och workshops arrangerats.

Vid en workshop i Graz i juni med rubriken "Developing migrants' language competences at work" fanns representanter för 31 av Europarådets medlemsländer samt Moskvas lingvistiska universitet. De 47 deltagarna hade olika bakgrund: forskare, lärare, administratörer med mera.

Som rubriken angav handlade workshopen om hur man kan stötta språkinlärning för migranter och minoritetsgrupper i arbetslivet, men också om hur lågutbildade modersmålstalare kan få stöd i sin språkutveckling. En punkt handlade om policy och praktik i de olika länderna och hur samverkan fungerar mellan dem som berörs: språklärare, vuxenutbildning, arbetsgivare, fackföreningar, kollegor, chefer m fl.

Programmet varvade föredrag av experter med gruppdiskussioner och mindre seminarier. Deltagarna hade olika erfarenheter och utgångsläge, men en gemensam nämnare var intresset för arbetslivet som centrum i språkinlärningen. För mer information, se www.languageforwork.ecml.at .
