

Brief summary of the content of the workshop	The workshop was focusing on the language competence required in the language of schooling in order to achieve educational success (age groups 11/12 and 15/16, subjects mathematics and civics/history). The aim of the workshop was to work on basis of preliminary descriptors and find out and how big amount of descriptors cover the language skills students need to follow and participate in lessons: in terms of listening, reading, learning and speaking.
What did you find particularly useful?	The best part of workshop for me was the sharing of experiences with the colleagues from different countries. I liked a lot the lecture of Dr. Curi-Anne Nortved: Coming to learn the language of mathematics.
How will you use what you learnt/ developed in the event in your professional context?	I got some new points of view how to approach students who's language skills are poor. I can prepare my lessons better, because I know much more details which are important for minority language speakers as well I can follow easily the development both in language and mathematics skills.
How will you further contribute to the project?	The work will still go on and I'm ready to comment a new, improved version of language descriptors.

Itävallan Grazissa järjestettiin EU:n rahoittama seminaari *Language descriptors for migrant and minority young learner's success in compulsory education* maaliskuun 7. ja 8. päivänä. Itävallan toiseksi suurin kaupunki tervehti osanottajiaa kauniilla kevätsäällä ja ihanan tunnelmallisella vanhalla kaupungilla. Tapahtumapaikkana ja organisoijana toimi ECML- European Centre for Modern Languages(ks. <http://www.ecml.at/>). Kypseisen järjestöön kuuluu 32 jäsenmaata ja yhtenä tarkoituksesta on edistää vähemmistökielten puhujien ja valtaväestön välistä kielellistä, kulttuurillista ja sosiaalista dialogia.

Seminaariin osallistui 30 matematiikan ja historian opettajia 17 eri Euroopan valtiosta. Yhdessä pohdittiin, minkälainen kielitaso (CEFR:n mukainen A1-C2 luokittelut, ks.

<http://www.helsinki.fi/kksc/opetus/taitotasot.html>) pitäisi olla peruskoulun niveltasolla kuullun, puhutun, luetun ja ymmärtämisen sekä suullisen vuorovaikutuksen että kirjallisten tuotosten osalta, että S2-oppilas voisi menestyä opinnoissa. Mielenkiintoisissa keskusteluissa tulivat selvästi esiin eri maiden yhteiset huolel siitä, kuinka paljon heikko tai puuttuva kielitaito voi vaikuttaa oppilaiden edistymiseen ja menestymiseen peruskoulussa ja jatko-opinnoissa. Hyviä vinkejä ja käytännössä toimivia neuvuja vaihdettiin työpajoissa puolin ja toisin. Lopullinen raportti julkaistaan tämän vuoden loppuun mennessä.
